Tapping Primary School are committed to continue our relentless focus on school improvement to ensure high quality teaching, based on informed evidence, in every classroom, every day.


It is with great pleasure to present the 2023 Annual Report. This report provides a summary of our school's performance and activities during the 2023 school year.

Priority One: Quality Teaching & Learning






This year we introduced Auslan as our Language Other than English. Lead by our Auslan Teacher, Mrs Walker, Auslan has been embraced by students, staff and parents alike.



2023 saw the school prioritise the implementation of consistent whole-school practices related to behaviour, routines, language, and literacy instruction. Whole school professional learning focused on high impact teaching strategies and explicit instruction.

Priority Two: Safe Learning Environment

Our Positive Behaviour Committee facilitated our selection of 3 new Values: Respect, Empathy and Achieve. Together we created our whole school matrix of expected behaviours. These are explicitly taught with fidelity across our school from Kindergarten to Year 6 and supports our students in creating a positive learning environment.



Priority Four: Leadership



Tapping Primary School was successful in their application to be part of **Centre for Excellence in Explicit Teaching of Literacy**.

The program provided an opportunity for our intern teachers and principal to build, strengthen and develop their capacity to extend explicit literacy teaching practices through:

- an annual internship program in high performing centre schools
- targeted professional learning from leading experts in the field of explicit instruction in literacy learning
- · coaching, observation, and feedback from skilled coaches
- access to a range of practical explicit teaching resources.

Throughout the year, we had visits between Tapping Primary School our mentor school, Warriapendi Primary School, to co-teach with their teachers.



The **GRIP Student Leadership Conference** is unique in that it concentrates specifically on training student leaders for their role as SCHOOL LEADERS. The style, topics, and content of this conference all focus on what the students can do RIGHT NOW. Our student leaders left our conference with a clear vision, a solid understanding and dozens of ideas for their time as a leader.

Priority Five: Resources

Thanks to budget funding and grants, we were able to upgrade the Tiger Turf outside the Year 1 classrooms. Additionally, with the help of a grant, we've installed a Fronius Solar Inverter and panels to help reduce our energy consumption.

The service offers wonderful indoor and outdoor environments for children to start their school day, unwind after school or join their friends for fun planned activities, incursions and excursions during school holidays. 


